There are no limits on the number of swimmers you wish to enter for the meet but please refer to the meet information below regarding entry/scoring limits.

Meet Information

Age Groups

- Age groups will be the following: 10&Under, 11-12, 13-14 and 15&Over.
- Age of the swimmer is as of the first day of the first BMAC swimming event each year on the BMAC calendar this is January 29, 2023.
- Swimmers are not permitted to swim up age groups including the participation of relay events.
- It is the discretion of the head coach of each competing school to enter a swimmer under the age of nine years old. It is discouraged that any swimmer of this age who has not previously competed long course, enter their first meet in a conference format.

Event Entries

- Swimmers are permitted to enter up to five individual events per day and can enter as many relay events within their respective age group.
- Swimmers who are looking to swim up an age group will have their entries automatically rejected.
- Entries will be due 5pm on Monday 6 March. Any entries beyond this point will not be accepted.
- Entry reports will be sent back to competing schools for checking.
- Any event corrections can be made and returned no later than 5pm. Any event corrections beyond this point will not be accepted.
- Psych sheets and meet programs will be shared with all visiting schools at 12pm on Thursday 9 March.

Rules and Regulations

- FINA rules will apply throughout the meet.
- Protests and scratches can be submitted by a team coach. No parental queries will be entertained. There will be a 30-minute time limit for protests following the posting of official results as per FINA rules.
- Electronic timing will be used along with a full TASA official's team
- All events will be run as timed finals.

Warm Up/Down Facilities

- A fixed warm up schedule will be shared with the competing schools when final information is shared in the week of the meet.
- The 25 pool will be available for athletes to use as a warm down pool.
- If schools wish athletes to use the warm down pool they must be accompanied by a coach of that school.

Scoring

- The top eight individual swimmers and top three relays may score points per event.
- A school may wish to enter as many individuals or relays as they can. Only the top three individuals and A relay can score in each event.

Awards

- Individuals and relays who finish 1st, 2nd or 3rd respectively will receive a medal for that event.
- Highest scoring age group teams, male and female will receive a trophy.
- Highest scoring male and female FINA point swimmers will receive a trophy.
- Record breakers at both events will receive a record breaker certificate.

Entry Fee

• There will be an entry fee of 1,000THB per swimmer.
